The Shelby County Board of Developmental Disabilities funds all providers of service for people with developmental disabilities.

We fund the following day support services:

(Funding for providers is approximately 40% local dollars and 60% federal dollars.)

Services delivered by Independent providers are funded by the Shelby County Board.

Local dollars support the staff who monitor the quality of services delivered by all providers, develop the plan of support for each person, and ensure the health and welfare of all people with developmental disabilities.

Additionally, the county board provides Early Intervention for children from birth to age three and preschool education for children ages 3 - 6 at Shelby Hills Early Childhood Center. The county board also provides preschool satellite classrooms at Ft. Loramie, Jackson Center and Hardin-Houston school districts.
